**Vehicle Restraint System installation work recommencing:
Marks Tey Station Bridge, North Lane, Marks Tey**

Essex Highways would like to make you aware that the work to install the Vehicle Restraint Barrier System to the railway bridge will recommence on **Monday 22 June 2020**.

In order to carry out this work a full road closure will be required and this will be put in place for all vehicles 24 hours a day over the bridge from Monday 22 June 2020 until December 2020. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

During the road closure a signed vehicle diversion will be in place via North Lane, Brook Road, New Road, A1124 Halstead Road, A1124 Essex Yeomanry Way, B1408 London Road, A120 Marks Tey Interchange, Station Road and vice versa.

We urge all drivers to take additional care and observe traffic management and signage in place during the closure. In particular, please be aware that vehicles travelling to and from Swift Scaffolding, which includes long vehicles, will have no alternative but to follow the diversion route during the closure.

We appreciate that these works may cause temporary noise and inconvenience to local residents for which we would like to apologise.

Please be aware that dates may be subject to change if the works are affected by poor weather or if unexpected issues arise.
